Entries may be taken on the day subject to Chief Steward's approval.

Incorrect entry forms will be posted back for correction and must be returned by the due date.

All care will be taken; however, no responsibility is accepted for any errors or omissions on the day.

The show reserves the right to amalgamate classes if not sufficient entries in a breed.

A minimum of two exhibitors and 8 heads of cattle each constitute a 'Breed Ring'

Competition is conducted according to Royal Agriculture Society Rules

Exhibitors of Dual Purpose Breed animals i.e. (Dairy or Beef) may only enter the Dairy section or the Beef section NOT BOTH

Tuberculosis Testing

1. For Animals from herds which are under movement restrictions imposed by an Official Directive or restricted Place notice issued by the Animal Health Board
 - a) The owner will have to satisfy the requirements of the Movement Control Notice before animals can move off the property to the Show. Provided these requirements are met the Animal Health Board cannot prevent these animals from being shown.
2. For Animals from declared Movement Control Areas
 - a) All Show Animals over the age of 90 days are to be tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to a Show.
 - b) For animal's from C10 status herds in Surveillance Areas e.g. Northland No test is required but a clearly dated test allocation form or other documentation from the AHB must be submitted that shows the herd is not overdue for a whole herd test.
3. For Animals from all other herds and areas
 - a) If the herd has a C3 status or better no test is required provided the last whole herd test was within 12 months prior to the Show
 - b) If the last whole herd test was not within 12 months of the show the Show Cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within the current Show season.
 - c) If the herd has a status of C1 or C2 then Show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within the current Show season.

All Dairy Cattle exhibited must come from an EBL negative or free herd.

Attention of all Exhibitors is drawn to the following requirements

All cattle must be haltered and capable of being led and all bulls (except calves) MUST be led by a ring through the nose and under adequate Adult supervision. Failure to observe this can mean an animal can be disqualified from parading.

It is recommended that there be two handlers for all Bulls up to 2 years and Mandatory for Bulls over 2 years

Protests: Any protest must be made, in writing, within one hour of judging the class in question, signed by the person making such protest and delivered to the Show Office. The protester shall, at the time of making such protest, lodge the sum of \$50.00 which shall be forfeited to the Society should the objection be considered frivolous or vexatious. All protests will be determined by the Judicial Committee whose decision shall be absolutely final and binding on all parties.

Eligibility

To be eligible for inclusion in any Special classes, animals must also be entered in the ordinary class they are eligible for. All Pedigree cattle must be entered in or be eligible for the Herd Book of their particular Breed.

Birth Dates

All birth dates to commence from 1st June.

Dress Code

Handlers must be appropriately attired e.g. Trousers, Shirt & Tie
White Coats and hats optional
Footwear – Strong Shoes or Boots – No Jandals or Gumboots

Prize Money will be paid out by cheque within three weeks after the Show.

Please print clearly on Entry Form Prize Money **Cheques Payable to.....**

Cheques not banked within 6 months of date of issue will be cancelled with no further recourse.

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident / illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the show grounds.

Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety in employment Act 1992. No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission of the head steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

**Both Dairy Cattle (Sat) and Beef Cattle (Sun) will be housed in the big shed.
A single cow milking machine will be provided conveniently located.**

MALCOLM HUTCHINGS NORTHERN DISTRICT RAS YOUNG HANDLER COMPETITION

Rules:

- This competition is run in the Northern District only, but any competitor in New Zealand can enter.
- Competitors up to and including 19 years of age are eligible to enter. The minimum age for Junior competitors is determined by their ability to handle stock/exhibit safely and independently. The maximum age is 12 years (inclusive) while the Senior is 13-19 years (inclusive). All ages are as of October 1st of the current show season.
- Entry is to be free to all competitors.
- The competitor may use cattle of any age and the animal does not have to be the property of the handler.
- The competitor may only enter the beef or dairy class, not both.
- To be eligible for the Northern District prize, the competitor must compete in three or more Northern District A&P Shows in the chosen class for the current Show season.
- The final show of the season is at Kumeu and competitors need to attend this show to be eligible for a placing.
- The competitor may enter as many shows as they wish, but their final score will be the average score from all the shows they have competed in for the current season.
- In the event of a tie the competitor with the highest number of first place wins then second place wins and so on will be the winner.
- If entries are low, competitors may be paraded together, however each class will be judged separately.
- Prize money at show level is to be provided by the show at \$20 for 1st place, \$10 for 2nd and \$5 for third.
- The highest-scoring Northern District competitors in each of the four classes will receive **\$130 for 1st place, \$100 for 2nd, \$75 for 3rd and \$45 for 4th**
Selwyn Driver and the Northern District Council sponsor all prize money and the winner of each class will receive a medal awarded by the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand.
- Shows are to record the names of all entrants regardless of placing. All placings are to be made to 6th place.
- Points to be awarded as follows:

Judging Guidelines

Shows are asked to brief Judges on the purpose and rules to ensure consistency in judging through the competition and District.

Presentation of the competitor

- The competitor is strongly advised to wear a plain white shirt with dark pants and clean, strong boots.
- No open footwear or gumboots are permitted;
- If a hat is worn it must be worn correctly;
- No logos or advertising whatsoever are to be present on any clothing including hats. This includes stud/breed names and breed uniforms.

Presentation of the animal

- The animal itself is not judged, however general presentation is to be taken into consideration as the competitor is expected to have prepared the animal for the ring;
- The competitor should make sure that the animal is washed and groomed with hair appropriately trimmed and clipped and hooves clean and tidy;
- The halter should be clean and fit the animal correctly. Rope or leather halters are allowed;
- For beef competitors if a show stick or cane is carried it is to be used correctly.

Parading of the animal

- The competitor should aim to display the animal in such a manner that the judge gains a clear view of the animal at all times, and that the animal is seen to advantage;
- They should know the weaknesses of the animal and not place the animal in a situation where these are going to be made obvious;
- They should be able to walk in tandem with the animal, without getting their foot caught under the animal's hoof;
- The competitor should be able to stop, move on and stand the animal up when requested;
- They should be aware of different leading styles: Dairy competitors lead from the front while Beef lead from the shoulder;
- Senior competitors may be asked to swap animals with other competitors. Juniors will not.
- Competitors in the Young Handler Classes must enter on the application form, no entries taken on the day.

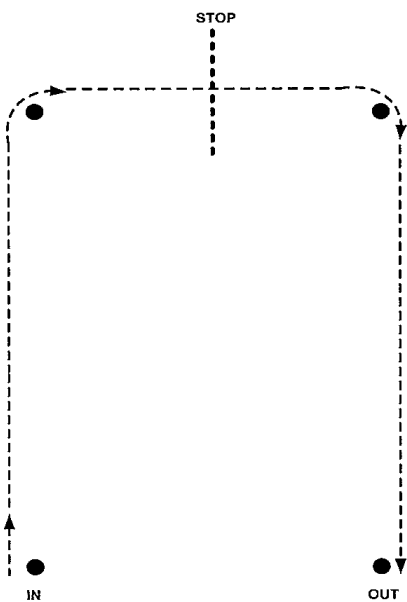

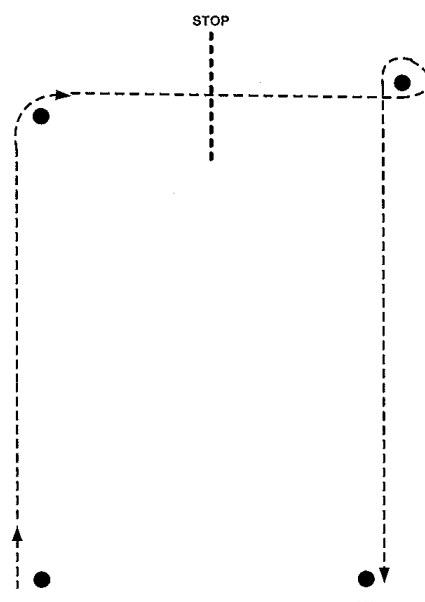
